SBJC's Strategic Plan Objectives. The district's Middle States Accreditation Planning Team analyzed the results of parent and staff surveys and used the data to identify these four key areas:

Our **Least Restrictive Environment** Objective will be the driving force behind our entire district vision, with our goal being to develop a formalized system that ensures the federal mandate of Least Restrictive Environment is being best achieved.

The South Bergen Jointure Commission will implement a strategic system of **Professional Development**. This objective will focus on all aspects of professional development, from hiring staff, to training new staff, to using data to drive professional developing offerings.

We will be improving our **Communication** processes, defining the district's internal and external audiences and putting strategies into place that will enhance the two-way process of giving and receiving information.

Our district's mission is to unlock the potential of every student. The SBJC's **Functional Independent Living Skills** objective will look at improving programming for Social/Emotional Skills, Functional Communication Skills, Community-Based Living Skills, and Independent Living Skills

Initiatives and Achievements



SBJC partners with **No Barriers USA**, a non-profit organization founded by **Erik Weihenmayer** (pictured above), the first blind person to climb Mount Everest. Our partnership includes: Weihenmayer charges up SBJC staff at 2019 New School Year Convocation; Faculty and staff receive training on No Barriers Life Elements and Mindset; SBJC leadership team goes on two-day No Barriers retreat to define district vision; SBJC and No Barriers collaborate in the organization of a No Barriers Day.

SBJC has been accepted as **Candidate Institution for Middle States Accreditation**. With a MSA visit in the works for Fall 2020, the SBJC will establish a mission, core values, and profile of a graduate with input from all groups of stakeholders. SBJC will also establish its first-ever district strategic plan, guided by the district vision: establishing a formalized system that best ensures the federal mandate of Least Restrictive environment is being achieved.

Creation of a **District Evaluation Advisory Committee** to create stronger connection and line of communication across the district in terms of: improving staff evaluation system and process; using evaluation data to guide professional development offerings; and using district professional development goals to guide development of individual PDPs.

SBJC partners with **Felician University's International Center for Autism and Disabilities Research & Education**. In 2018-19, John Burke of Felician University led district-wide professional development in using ABA/PRT strategies. In 2019-20, SBJC opens three classrooms at Felician University to accommodate for growing preschool program, and SBJC and Felician form a Veteran Mentorship Program between our students and Felician veteran students.

Rutgers Douglass Developmental Disabilities Center evaluates the educational programming of all three main SBJC campuses, providing the district with data to use for strategic planning and improvement.

With our **Mindfulness Initiative**, in 2018-19 we introduced our district to Yoga/Meditation Programs through an outside service. This current school year, the SBJC hired a teacher to develop and implement a district Yoga and Mindfulness Course (pictured below).



Four parent workshops were held last school year for SBJC parents in partnership with **POAC**. Thank you Primetime Parent, Lauren Bergner, for organizing these wonderful events. Keep posted for Spring 2020 Parent workshops.

District expands **CPI Instructor Training** to teachers and paraprofessionals

SBJC co-sponsors **2019 Bergen County Transition Fair**, providing information on transitioning students with all levels of disabilities into the next phase of their life.

The district increases **accessibility to safety equipment** throughout district for the safety of both students and staff.

Lodi Campus increases **Community Based Instruction** to two days a week to boost student access to the community.



First-ever district **pet therapy visits** (pictured above) occur at our three SBJC campuses.

SBJC develops a model for paraprofessional supervision in order to evaluate our largest group of staff.




Maywood Campus Students Attend Big Apple Circus

At SBJC, ensuring that our students receive instruction which reflects their individual needs and challenges them appropriately is of utmost importance. By combining IEP-driven instruction with exposure to the content and skills outlined in the state's academic standards, SBJC students are provided with a comprehensive educational experience focused on increasing their academic success and overall independence.

Outlining the use of both grade-level and intervention resources, the SBJC has developed and offers curricula in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Technology, Comprehensive Health/Physical Education, and Visual/Performing Arts. Additionally, SBJC also implements a district-developed Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) curriculum that is utilized across all grade levels.
